

CSS - ROLL IN EFFECT

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Description

An Element can move in a particular direction by turning over and over on an axis.

Syntax

```
@keyframes rollIn {  
  0% { opacity: 0; transform: translateX(-100%) rotate(-120deg); }  
  100% { opacity: 1; transform: translateX(0px) rotate(0deg); }  
}
```

Parameters

- **Transform** – Transform applies to 2d and 3d transformation to an element
- **Opacity** – Opacity applies to an element to make translucence

        -webkit-animation-name: rollIn;  
        animation-name: rollIn;  
      }
