Description

sets the width of the top border of an element.

Possible Values

- **length** – Any length unit. Length units for this property may not be negative.
- **thin** – A border which is thinner than a border set to medium.
- **medium** – A border which is thicker than a border set to thin, and thinner than a border set to thick.
- **thick** – A border which is thicker than a border set to medium.

Applies to

All the HTML elements.

DOM Syntax

```
object.style.borderTopWidth = "2px";
```

Example

Following is the example to show all the border width –

    This is a solid border whose width is 4px.
  </p>

  <p style="border-width:4pt; border-style:solid;">
    This is a solid border whose width is 4pt.
  </p>

  <p style="border-width:thin; border-style:solid;">
    This is a solid border whose width is thin.
  </p>

  <p style="border-width:medium; border-style:solid;">
    This is a solid border whose width is medium;
  </p>

  <p style="border-width:thick; border-style:solid;">
    This is a solid border whose width is thick.
  </p>

  <p style="border-bottom-width:4px;
    border-top-width:10px;
    border-left-width: 2px;
    border-right-width:15px;
    border-style:solid;">

    This is a a border with four different width.
  </p>
