

Description

The *empty-cell* property is used in the separate-border table layout model to control the rendering of table cells which have no visible content.

Possible Values

- **show** – The borders of an empty cell are rendered.
- **hide** – The borders of an empty cell are not drawn.

Applies to

All the elements with a display of table-cell.

DOM Syntax

```
object.style.emptyCell = "hide";
```

Example

Here is the empty-cells property used to hide borders of empty cells in the <table> element.
