

Description

The *width* sets the width of an element's content area.

Possible Values

- **length** – Any length unit. Negative length values are not permitted for this property.
- **percentage** – The width is calculated with respect to the width of the element's containing block, assuming that the containing block's width has been explicitly set.
- **auto** – Default. The browser calculates the actual width.

Applies to

All the HTML elements except non-replaced inline elements, table rows, and row groups.

DOM Syntax

```
object.style.width = "100px";
```

Example

Here is the example –

    </p>
