GDB offers a big list of commands, however the following commands are the ones used most frequently:

- **b main** Puts a breakpoint at the beginning of the program
- **b** Puts a breakpoint at the current line
- **b N** Puts a breakpoint at line N
- **b** +N Puts a breakpoint N lines down from the current line
- **b fn** Puts a breakpoint at the beginning of function "fn"
- d N Deletes breakpoint number N
- info break list breakpoints
- r Runs the program until a breakpoint or error
- c Continues running the program until the next breakpoint or error
- f Runs until the current function is finished
- s Runs the next line of the program
- **s N** Runs the next N lines of the program
- **n** Like s, but it does not step into functions
- **u** N Runs until you get N lines in front of the current line
- p var Prints the current value of the variable "var"
- bt Prints a stack trace
- **u** Goes up a level in the stack
- **d** Goes down a level in the stack
- **q** Quits gdb
