

JAVA.LANG.STRING.VALUEOF METHOD

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Description

The **java.lang.String.valueOf** method returns the string representation of the **char** argument.

Declaration

Following is the declaration for **java.lang.String.valueOf** method

```
public static String valueOf(char c)
```

Parameters

- **c** -- This is a char value.

Return Value

This method returns a string of length 1 containing as its single character the argument c.

Exception

- NA

Example

The following example shows the usage of java.lang.String.valueOf method.

```
package com.tutorialspoint;

import java.lang.*;

public class StringDemo {

    public static void main(String[] args) {

        String str1 = String.valueOf('k');
        String str2 = String.valueOf('m');

        // print the string representation of char
        System.out.println(str1);
        System.out.println(str2);
    }
}
```

Let us compile and run the above program, this will produce the following result:

```
k
m
```

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
