

JAVA.UTIL.ARRAYS.TOSTRINGBOOLEAN[] METHOD

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Description

The **java.util.Arrays.toStringboolean[]** method returns a string representation of the contents of the specified boolean array. The string representation consists of a list of the array's elements, enclosed in square brackets " [] ". Adjacent elements are separated by the characters ", " *comma followed by space*.

Declaration

Following is the declaration for **java.util.Arrays.toString** method

```
public static String toString(boolean[] a)
```

Parameters

- **a** -- This is the array whose string representation to return.

Return Value

This method returns a string representation of *a*.

Exception

- **NA**

Example

The following example shows the usage of java.util.Arrays.toString method.

```
package com.tutorialspoint;

import java.util.Arrays;

public class ArrayDemo {

    public static void main(String[] args) {

        // initializing boolean array
        boolean[] b1 = new boolean[] { true, false };

        // let us print all the values available in list
        System.out.println("The array is:");
        for (boolean value : b1) {
            System.out.println("Value = " + value);
        }

        System.out.println("The string representation of array is:");
        System.out.println(Arrays.toString(b1));
    }
}
```

Let us compile and run the above program, this will produce the following result:

```
The array is:
Value = true
Value = false
The string representation of array is:
[true, false]
```

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
