

JAVA.UTIL.BITSET.LENGTH METHOD

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Description

The **java.util.BitSet.length** method returns the "logical size" of this BitSet: the index of the highest set bit in the BitSet plus one. Returns zero if the BitSet contains no set bits.

Declaration

Following is the declaration for **java.util.BitSet.length** method

```
public int length()
```

Parameters

Return Value

This method returns the logical size of this BitSet.

The following example shows the usage of java.util.BitSet.length method.

```
package com.tutorialspoint;

import java.util.*;

public class BitSetDemo {

    public static void main(String[] args) {

        // create 2 bitsets
        BitSet bitset1 = new BitSet(8);
        BitSet bitset2 = new BitSet(8);

        // assign values to bitset1
        bitset1.set(0);
        bitset1.set(1);
        bitset1.set(2);
        bitset1.set(3);
        bitset1.set(4);
        bitset1.set(5);

        // assign values to bitset2
        bitset2.set(2);
        bitset2.set(4);
        bitset2.set(6);
        bitset2.set(8);
        bitset2.set(10);

        // print the sets
        System.out.println("Bitset1:" + bitset1);
        System.out.println("Bitset2:" + bitset2);

        // print the length of each bitset
        System.out.println(" " + bitset1.length());
        System.out.println(" " + bitset2.length());
    }
}
```

```

```

Let us compile and run the above program, this will produce the following result:

```
Bitset1:{0, 1, 2, 3, 4, 5}  
Bitset2:{2, 4, 6, 8, 10}  
6  
11
```

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
