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Description

The **java.util.Calendar.isLenient** method tells if date and time interpretation are to be lenient.

Declaration

Following is the declaration for **java.util.Calendar.isLenient** method

```
public boolean isLenient()
```

Parameters

- NA

Return Value

true if the interpretation mode is lenient; **false** if it is not.

Exception

- NA

Example

The following example shows the usage of java.util.calendar.isLenient method.

```
package com.tutorialspoint;

import java.util.*;

public class CalendarDemo {

    public static void main(String[] args) {

        // create a calendar
        Calendar cal = Calendar.getInstance();

        // displays the current calendar
        System.out.println("Current Date and Time is " + cal.getTime());

        // tells whether date/time interpretation is lenient.
        boolean b = cal.isLenient();
        System.out.println("Interpretation is lenient: " + b);
    }
}
```

Let us compile and run the above program, this will produce the following result:

```
Current Date and Time is Sat May 05 17:06:13 EEST 2012
Interpretation is lenient: true
```

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
