

JAVA.UTIL.ENUMSET.NONEOF METHOD

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Description

The **java.util.EnumSet.noneOfClass** $\langle E \rangle$ *elementType* method creates an empty enum set with the specified element type.

Declaration

Following is the declaration for **java.util.EnumSet.noneOf** method

```
public static <E extends Enum<E>> EnumSet<E> noneOf(Class<E> elementType)
```

Parameters

- **elementType** -- the class object of the element type for this enum set.

Return Value

This method does not return any value.

Exception

- **NullPointerException** -- if elementType is null

Example

The following example shows the usage of java.util.EnumSet.noneOf method.

```
package com.tutorialspoint;

import java.util.*;

public class EnumSetDemo {

    // create an enum
    public enum Numbers {

        ONE, TWO, THREE, FOUR, FIVE
    };

    public static void main(String[] args) {

        // create a set that contains all Numbers class
        EnumSet<Numbers> set1 = EnumSet.allOf(Numbers.class);

        // print set1
        System.out.println("Set1:" + set1);

        // create a second set which is empty
        EnumSet<Numbers> set2 = EnumSet.noneOf(Numbers.class);

        // print the new set
        System.out.println("Set2:" + set2);

    }
}
```

Let us compile and run the above program, this will produce the following result:

```
Set1:[ONE, TWO, THREE, FOUR, FIVE]
Set2:[]
```
