

JAVA.UTIL.LINKEDLIST.PEEKLAST METHOD

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Description

The **java.util.LinkedList.peekLast** method retrieves, but does not remove, the last element of this list, or returns null if this list is empty.

Declaration

Following is the declaration for **java.util.LinkedList.peekLast** method

```
public E peekLast()
```

Parameters

- NA

Return Value

This method returns the last element of this list, or null if this list is empty

Exception

- NA

Example

The following example shows the usage of java.util.LinkedList.peekLast method.

```
package com.tutorialspoint;

import java.util.*;

public class LinkedListDemo {

    public static void main(String[] args) {

        // create a LinkedList
        LinkedList list = new LinkedList();

        // add some elements
        list.add("Hello");
        list.add(2);
        list.add("Chocolate");
        list.add("10");

        // print the list
        System.out.println("LinkedList:" + list);

        // peek at the last element
        System.out.println("Last element of the list:" + list.peekLast());
    }
}
```

Let us compile and run the above program, this will produce the following result:

```
LinkedList:[Hello, 2, Chocolate, 10]
Last element of the list:10
```

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
