Description

ignoreCase is a read-only boolean property of RegExp objects. It specifies whether a particular regular expression performs case-insensitive matching, i.e., whether it was created with the "i" attribute.

Syntax

Its syntax is as follows –

```
RegExpObject.ignoreCase
```

Return Value

Returns "TRUE" if the "i" modifier is set, "FALSE" otherwise.

Example

Try the following example program.

```

  <title>JavaScript RegExp ignoreCase Property</title>

  <script type="text/javascript">
    var re = new RegExp( "string" );

    if ( re.ignoreCase ){
      document.write("Test1-ignoreCase property is set");
    }
    else
    {
      document.write("Test1-ignoreCase property is not set");
    }
    re = new RegExp( "string", "i" );

    if ( re.ignoreCase ){
      document.write("<br/>Test2-ignoreCase property is set");
    }
    else
    {
      document.write("<br/>Test2-ignoreCase property is not set");
    }
  </script>

</body>
</html>
```

Output

```
Test1 - ignoreCase property is not set
Test2 - ignoreCase property is set
```
