

PERL CHOMP FUNCTION

Description

This safer version of chop removes any trailing string that corresponds to the current value of `$_` (also known as `INPUT_RECORD_SEPARATOR` in the English module). It returns the total number of characters removed from all its arguments. By default `$/` is set to new line character.

Syntax

Following is the simple syntax for this function –

```
chomp VARIABLE  
chomp( LIST )  
chomp
```

Return Value

This function returns Integer, number of bytes removed for all strings.

Example

Following is the example code showing its basic usage –

```
#!/usr/bin/perl  
  
$string1 = "This is test";  
$retval  = chomp( $string1 );  
  
print " Choped String is : $string1\n";  
print " Number of characters removed : $retval\n";  
  
$string1 = "This is test\n";  
$retval  = chomp( $string1 );  
  
print " Choped String is : $string1\n";  
print " Number of characters removed : $retval\n";
```

When above code is executed, it produces the following result –

```
Choped String is : This is test  
Number of characters removed : 0  
Choped String is : This is test  
Number of characters removed : 1
```
