

CONCATENATION OPERATORS IN VBSCRIPT

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Following table shows all the Concatenation operators supported by VBScript language. Assume variable A holds 5 and variable B holds 10, then:

Operator	Description	Example
+	Adds two Values as Variable Values are Numeric	A + B will give 15
&	Concatenates two Values	A & B will give 510

Example

Try the following example to understand the Concatenation operator available in VBScript:

```
<!DOCTYPE html>
<html>
<body>
<script language="vbscript" type="text/vbscript">
  Dim a : a = 5
  Dim b : b = 10
  Dim c

  c=a+b
  Document.write ("Concatenated value:1 is " &c) 'Numeric addition
  Document.write ("<br></br>") 'Inserting a Line Break for readability
  c=a&b
  Document.write ("Concatenated value:2 is " &c) 'Concatenate two numbers
  Document.write ("<br></br>") 'Inserting a Line Break for readability
</script>
</body>
</html>
```

When you save it as .html and execute it in Internet Explorer, then the above script will produce the following result:

```
Concatenated value:1 is 15
Concatenated value:2 is 510
```

Concatenation can also be used for concatenating two strings. Assume variable A="Microsoft" and variable B="VBScript" then:

Operator	Description	Example
+	Concatenates two Values	A + B will give MicrosoftVBScript
&	Concatenates two Values	A & B will give MicrosoftVBScript

Example

Try the following example to understand the Concatenation operator available in VBScript:

```
<!DOCTYPE html>
<html>
<body>
<script language="vbscript" type="text/vbscript">
```

```
Dim a : a = "Microsoft"
Dim b : b = "VBScript"
Dim c

c=a+b
Document.write ("Concatenated value:1 is " &c) 'Numeric addition
Document.write ("<br></br>") 'Inserting a Line Break for readability
c=a&b
Document.write ("Concatenated value:2 is " &c) 'Concatenate two numbers
Document.write ("<br></br>") 'Inserting a Line Break for readability
</script>
</body>
</html>
```

When you save it as .html and execute it in Internet Explorer, then the above script will produce the following result:

```
Concatenated value:1 is MicrosoftVBScript
Concatenated value:2 is MicrosoftVBScript
```
